- Maintenance for operating subs


Procedures include;



Worldwide Commercial Jet Fleet | 1959 through 2016









What is STE?

- ☐ Set of Writing Rules
- ■Dictionary of controlled words
- □One word = one meaning

Benefits of STE

- Reduces ambiguity
- □Improved clarity
- □ Improved comprehension
- □Improved consistency

Key Points to Writing Procedures



- Short sentences
- Paragraphs less than six sentences
- No slang or jargon
- Avoid passive voice
- Be specific as possible
- Use articles such as "a/an" and "the" where possible
- Use simple verb tenses
- Sequential steps as separate sentences
- Introduce a list item with a dash
- Use graphics where need to provide clarity
- Use words such as "Warning" and "Caution"

Before and After STE



Before

The synthetic lubricating oil used in this engine contains additives which, if allowed to come into contact with the skin for prolonged periods, can be toxic through absorption.

After

Do not get the engine oil on your skin. The oil is poisonous. It can go through your skin and into your body.


